It is in reference to the project "Chhota Daminbhitta Stone Mine of M/s Star India Industries of Sri Ajay Kumar Bhagat at Khata No.-37, Plot No.-33 (P) & 60 (P), Khata No.-20, Plot No.-34, Khata No.- 30, Plot No.- 35, Khata No.- 19, Plot No.- 36, Khata No.- 05, Plot No.- 56 (P), Khata No.- 07, Plot No.57 (P) at Village- Chhota Daminbhitta, Tehsil- Mandro, Dist.- Sahibgani Jharkhand (4.86 Ha)"submitted by you for seeking prior Environmental Clearances(EC).

The proposal was appraised by State Level Expert Appraisal Committee (SEAC) and recommended for grant of Environmental Clearance in its meeting held on 10th to 15th September, 2015.

State Level Environment Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA), Jharkhand in its meeting held on 19.10.2015 discussed the project proposal along with recommendations made by SEAC and decided to grant EC to the project.

Following the decision of SEIAA, as mentioned above, Environmental Clearance is hereby issued to the "Chhota Daminbhitta Stone Mine of M/s Star India Industries of Sri Ajay Kumar Bhagat at Khata No.- 37, Plot No.- 33 (P) & 60 (P), Khata No.- 20, Plot No.- 34, Khata No.- 30, Plot No.- 35, Khata No.- 19, Plot No.- 36, Khata No.- 05, Plot No.- 56 (P), Khata No.- 07, Plot No.57 (P) at Village- Chhota Daminbhitta, Tehsil- Mandro, Dist.- Sahibgani Jharkhand (4.86 Ha)"alongwith the following conditions-

- This Environmental Clearance is valid subject to the following condition below –
 That this project has
 - a. Obtained all legal rights to operate at concerned place.
 - b. Complied with all existing concerned laws of the land and
 - c. Complied with the decisions of SEIAA on the issue of Environmental Clearance till date.
- 2. A matter in the context of Environmental Clearance to Chururia Sand Ghat in Barakar River of M/S Starnet Marketing Pvt Ltd at Village- Chururia, Ghurnbeda & Daldali, P.S- Tundi, District- Dhanbad, Jharkhand (14.30 Ha) has come to the notice of SEIAA in which mining lease has been granted by the Mining department on such a piece of Land in which two plots have been found within the forest area and this has also come to the notice of SEAC during examination of the records submitted by the concerned proponent.

SEIAA in it's 35th meeting dated 13.08.2015 decided that SEAC will considered after taking undertaking from the proponent about the distance from forest boundary to avoid the delay in obtaining the certificate of D.F.O.

But as matter mentioned in para 1 it has come to the knowledge of SEIAA that if the undertaking given by the proponent is found to be wrong and if the mining Lease granted by the Department of Mines and Geology in such an area where the land or any part of it under lease is found at any level or by any authority to be inside notified forest or demarcated forest or Jungle Jhari area (as recorded in revenue records). SEIAA decides that the E.C. issued will be treated as invalid / cancelled with immediate effect.

- 3. The environmental clearance is subject to grant of mining lease by the Department of Mines, Government of Jharkhand to PP and all other Statutory Conditions as imposed by various agencies / District Authorities are complied with.
- 4. SEIAA decides that this condition will apply in all the similar cases in which E.C. has already been issued earlier
- 5. The project proponent shall obtain Consent to Establish and Consent to Operate from the Jharkhand State Pollution Control Board, Ranchi and effectively implement all the conditions stipulated therein.
- 6. At the time of obtaining Consent to establish/ Consent to Operate, PP should submit site map duly signed by PP and DMO to JSPCB & SEIAA.
- 7. At the time of obtaining consent to operate, PP will erect boundary pillars to demarcate boundary of lease. GPS reading, backward forward bearing & pillar to pillar distance is to written on each pillar. Pillar wise list will be submitted to SEIAA and JSPCB before issue of Consent to Establish/ Consent to Operate.
- 8. No mining shall be undertaken in the forest area without obtaining requisite prior forestry clearance. Minimum distance shall be maintained from Reserved / ProtectedForest as stipulated in SEIAA Guidelines.
- Environmental clearance is subject to final order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India / MOEF Guidelines applicable to Minor Minerals.
- 10. Environmental clearance is subject to obtaining clearance under the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 from the competent authority, as may be applicable to this project (in case any fauna occurs / is found in the Project area). No damage is to be done to fauna if found in ML area (as mentioned in various schedules). In case found they should be given protection, collected alive with the help of the expert and transferred them or handing over them to the concerned authorities.
- 11. The mining operations shall be restricted to above ground water table and it should not intersect the groundwater table. In case of working below the ground water table, prior approval of the Ground Water Directorate, Government of Jharkhand / Central Ground Water Board shall be obtained. Benches height and slope shall be maintained as per approved Mining Plan. The Mining Plan has to be got approved by concerned authorities as per SEIAA guidelines. Safety measures shall be adopted in line with DGMS Guidelines.

- 12. PP shall maintain minimum distance from Reserved / ProtectedForests as stipulated in applicable guidelines.
- 13. The project proponent shall ensure that no natural watercourse and / or water resources shall be obstructed due to any mining operations. Adequate measures shall be taken for conservation and protection of the first order and the second order streams, if any emanating / passing through the mine lease area during the course of mining operation.
- 14. The top soil, if any shall temporarily be stored at earmarked site(s) only and it should not be kept unutilized for long. The topsoil shall be used for land reclamation and plantation.
- 15. There shall be no external dump(s). Monitoring and management of rehabilitated areas shall continue until the vegetation becomes self-sustaining. Compliance status shall be submitted to the Jharkhand State Pollution Control Board, Ranchi and its nearest Regional Office on six monthly basis.
- 16. Catch drains and siltation ponds of appropriate size shall be constructed around the mine working, sub-grade and mineral dump(s) to prevent run off of water and flow of sediments directly into the agricultural fields, and other water bodies. The water so collected should be utilized for watering the mine area, haul roads, green belt development etc. The drains shall be regularly desalted particularly after the monsoon and maintained properly.
- 17. Dimension of the retaining wall at the toe of the OB benches within the mine to check runoff and siltation shall be based on the rain fall data.
- 18. Greenbelt shall be developed all along the mine lease area and haul roads. The Project proponent shall do tree plantation in at least 33% of the space, preferably along the periphery and in vacant space. Past growing and local species will be planted. In case land is not available within the lease area or it is not possible to plant trees due to nature of land then PP will do necessary a forestation at other places / land.
- 19. Effective safeguard measure such as regular water sprinkling shall be carried out in critical areas prone to air pollution and having high levels of particulate matter such as loading and unloading point and transfer roads which should be madensured that the Ambient Ambient Central Pollution Control Be-

- 28. The project proponent shall take all precautionary measures during mining operation for conservation and protection of endangered fauna.
- 29. Provision shall be made for the housing of a struction labour within the site with all necessary infrastructure and facilities such as free for cooking, mobile toilets, septic tanks, safe drinking water, medical health care, etc. The housing may be in the form of temporary structures to be removed after the completion of the project.
- 30. Proper safety measures as per statutory requirement are to be implemented around the mined out Pit prior to closure of site.
- 31. A final mine closure Plan along with corpus tand duly approved by Competent Authority shall be submitted to the Jharkhand State Pollution Control Board, Ranchi and to concerned DMO in advance of final mine closure for approval.

B. General conditions

- 1. No change in mining technology and scope of working should be made without prior approval of the statutory authorities / Department of Mines, Government of Jharkhand/ Jharkhand State Pollution Control Board, Ranchi during the EC period.
- 2. No change in the calendar plan including executation, quantum of mineral and waste should be made.
- 3. The Project proponent shall make all internal roads puccaandshall maintain a good housekeeping by regular cleaning and wetting of the haul roads and the premises.
- 4. The Project proponent shall maintain register for production and dispatch and submit return to the Board.
- 5. The Project proponent shall not cut trees / carry out tree felling in leased out area without the permission of competent authority.
- 6. Measures should be taken for control of noise levels below prescribed norms in the work environment. Workers engaged in operations of HEMM, etc. should be provided with ear plugs / muffs.
- 7. Industrial waste water (workshop and waste water from the mine) should be properly collected, treated so as to conform to the standards Oil and grease trap should be installed before discharge of workshop effluents.
- 8. Personnel working in dusty areas should wear protective respiratory devices and they should also be provided with adequate training and information on safety and health aspects. Occupational health surveillance program of the workers should be undertaken periodically to observe any contractions due to exposure to dust and take corrective measures, if needed.
- 9. Dispensary facilities for First Aid shall be provided at site.
- 10. A separate environmental management / monitoring cell with suitable qualified personnel should be set-up under the control of a Senior Executive, who will report directly to the Head of the Organization.
- 11. The funds earmarked for environmental protection measures should be kept in separate account and should not be diverted for other purpose. Year wise expenditure should be reported to the Jharkhand State Pollution Control Board, Ranchi. PP shall carry out CSRactivities as per Government Guidelines (%of Profit / turnover) or at least Rs 1 per ton whichever is higher.
- 12. The Jharkhand State Pollution Control Board, Ranchi directly or through its Regional Office, shall monitor compliance of the stipulated conditions. The project authorities should extend full cooperation to the officer (s) by furnishing the requisite data / information / monitoring reports.
- 13. The project proponent shall submit six monthly reports on the status of compliance of the stipulated environmental clearance conditions including results of monitored data (both in hard copies as well as by e-mail) to the Jharkhand State Pollution Control Board, Ranchi and to its concerned Regional Office.
- 14. The proponent shall upload the status of compliance of the environmental clearance conditions, including results of monitored data on their website and shall update the same periodically. It shall simultaneously be sent to Jharkhand State Pollution Control Board and

its concerned Regional Office The criteria pollutant levels namely; SPM, RSPM, SO2, NOx (ambient levels) or critical sectoral parameters, indicated for the project shall be monitored and displayed at a convenient location near the project shall be monitored and displayed at a convenient location near the main gate of the company in the company in the public domain.

- 15. A copy of the clearance letter shall be sent by the project proponent to concerned Panchayat, ZilaParisad / Municipal Corporation, Urban Local Body and the Local NGO, if any, from whom suggestions/ representations, if any, were received while processing the proposal. The clearance letter shall also be put on the website of the Company by the project proponent.
- 16. The environmental statement for each financial year ending 31st March in Form-V as is mandated to be submitted by the project proponent to the Jharkhand State Pollution Control Board as prescribed under the Environment (Protection) Rules, 1986, as amended subsequently, shall also be put on the website of the company along the status of compliance of EC condition, and snall also to the concerned Regional Office of JSPCB by e-mail.
- 17. All statutory clearances shall be obtained before start of mining operations.

C. Other points

- 1. The SEIAA reserves the right to add any new condition or modify the above condition(s) or to revoke the clearance a concations stipulated above are not implemented to the satisfaction of Authority or for that matter for any administrative reason.
- 2. The Environmental Clearance accorded shall be valid for the period of grant of lease for the mine (generally 10 years). The PP shall not increase production rate and alter lease area during the validity of Environmental Clearance.
- 3. In case of any deviation the tion in the project proposed from those submitted to SEIAA, Jharkhand for clearace, a resh reference should be made to SEIAA to assess the adequacy of the conditions in posed and to incorporate any new conditions if required.
- 4. The above stipulations would be reforced among others under the Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act. 1 ... Air (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, the . Hazardous Wastes (Management, Handling and Tran Environment (Protection) boundary Movement) and the Public Liability Insurance Act, 1991 along with their amendments and rule and also any order passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India/ Hi, would of Jharkhand or any other Court of Law relating to the subject matter.
- 5. Any Appeal against this with account Clearance shall lie with the National Green Tribunal, if produced, suffer ad at 10 days as prescribed under Section 16 of the National Green Libun L. C.
